"The patient response has been nothing short of incredible," said Keillor. "Patients have stated that they come to the group with anxiety, stress, and depression. When they leave a group, they feel the complete opposite expressing calmness, serenity. gratitude, hopefulness, happiness."

When not working group setting, Oakley is at Keillor's

supplementing therapeutic visits with her soothing presence. This is particularly important during the difficult detoxification of portion patients' stay. Withdrawal from any substance can be painful and debilitating. Moreover, many patients are missing their own pets at home while in treatment, and Oakley serves as an able stand-in.

In spite of her youth, Oakley brings advanced experience in treatment. She has been in longterm care facilities since being eight months old, previously serving at a separate treatment center in Connecticut. When she's not working, Oakley lives with Keillor and the rest of their family in Wading River, NY.
